## City of Stonecrest Issues State of Emergency

**STONECREST, GA (JANUARY 23, 2026)** – With the forecasted severe weather expected throughout the metro region, the City of Stonecrest is declaring a state of emergency and will close all administrative buildings — including City Hall, Browns Mill Recreation Center, and all City parks and facilities — beginning Saturday, January 24, through Monday, January 26. Monday's City Council meeting has been rescheduled for Wednesday, January 28, at 6 p.m.

"Our top priority is ensuring the safety and well-being of everyone within Stonecrest, and we encourage everyone to remain indoors, seek shelter and stay safe, particularly our elderly and other vulnerable populations," said Stonecrest Mayor Jazzmin Cobble.

Forecasts throughout the weekend call for freezing rain, sleet, and low temperatures. The City will continue to monitor weather conditions and provide updates as necessary.
