ORDNANCE 2017-05-03

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE COMMENCEMENT DATE OF THE
TWOYEAR TRANSITION PERIOD FOR THE CITY OF STONECREST

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council are the governing authority of the City of Stonecrest, Georgia;

WHEREAS, the City of Stonecrest was created by Senate Bill 208, passed in the Georgia General Assembly during the 2016 Session and subsequently confirmed by referendum;

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 208 provided a charter for the City of Stonecrest (the "City Charter");

WHEREAS, Section 6.03(b) of the City Charter states there shall be a two-year transition period as allowed by law beginning at 12:01 A.M. on January 1, 2017;

WHEREAS, Section 6.04 of the City Charter provides that if the first election provided for in Section 2.02 [of the City Charter] occurs after the date of the 2016 November general election, the city council shall be authorized to delay the dates otherwise specified in Section 6.03 of [the City Charter];

WHEREAS, the first election provided for in Section 2.02 of the City Charter occurred after the date of the 2016 November general election; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined it to be in the best interest of the City to delay the dates specified in Section 6.03(b) of the City Charter to May 8, 2017 such date being the date of the first regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council for the City of Stonecrest as follows:

Section 1. That the two-year transition period of the City of Stonecrest shall commence on May 8, 2017, such date being the date the of the first regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council, in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter.

Section 2. That the Mayor and City Attorney are hereby authorized and directed to deliver an executed copy of this Ordinance and concurrent correspondence to DeKalb County, notifying DeKalb County that the City has elected to delay the commencement date of the two-year transition period to May 8, 2017 pursuant to Section 6.04 of the City Charter. The Mayor and City


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Attorney are hereby authorized to conduct all actions necessary to effect the provisions of this Ordinance.


